From Fur Trading to Raising Livestock Boggsville


Educational Activity: Learn how Boggsville became the center of commerce and agriculture for the region after the decline of the fur trade.

Observation: Take a virtual tour of the reconstructed <u>Thomas Boggs House</u> and the <u>John Powers House</u> in Boggsville. Read about the <u>Boggsville Historic Site</u>.

Visit Boggsville, which was named after Thomas O. Boggs (b. 1824), the great-grandson of Daniel Boone and a cattle dealer.

Questions to Ask:

- 1. What years did the mid-19th century contain?
- 2. Who are some famous people who came through Boggsville? (Kit Carson, Wild Bill Hickock)
- 3. How is Mr. Boggs related to Bent's Fort?
- 4. How is Boggsville similar to and different from Bent's Old Fort? If you have paper, create a Venn Diagram to show the similarities and differences (see below).





Activity: Postcard From Boggsville

On one side of a piece of paper draw an image of Boggsville (a room, the view from the outside, i.e.) and on the other side write a postcard to a friend, explaining what life was like in Boggsville in the mid 1800's.
