## Background:

The Georgetown Loop Railroad is a narrow-gauge railroad between Silver Plume and Georgetown that transports riders back to the years when railroads were the main source of transportation of people and goods. An early visitor attraction that brought people to the Rocky Mountains of Colorado, the train was dismantled in the late 1930's/early 1940's.
