Life Cycle of a Fish Leadville National Fish Hatchery

Background:

During a trip to the Leadville National Fish Hatchery, visitors will glimpse the fish production process in action. The hatchery supports the replenishment of the state's fish population to encourage a viable population and ensure Colorado's lakes and streams provide fishing opportunities for recreational users for years to come. Learn more about the history of the Leadville National Fish Hatchery.

All animals and plants pass through a series of stages during their lifetime, called a life cycle. Fish are no different and go through similar stages as other living things during their life cycle.

Activity: Take a self-guided tour of the hatchery and brownstone buildings. After your tour, complete the Life Cycle of a Fish diagram below identifying the stages a fish goes through during their life. Draw a picture in each box and label (see word alert below) to show the stages of the life cycle.

Word Alert:

- Egg Laid by adult fish; they hatch into larva
- Larva Recently hatched fish that feed off their yolk sac for nutrition
- Fry Small fish that can feed itself
- Juvenile Young fish that spends its time eating and growing; Starts to look like an adult fish
- Adult Full grown fish that can lay eggs and start the cycle again
